

On April 23, 1928 Shirley Temple was born. In Fall, 1929 she was 1 ½ years old. During Fall, 1931 when she was 3 ½, her mom enrolled her at Meglin, where she learned all sorts of styles of dances, as well as singing and acting. When she was 5 years old, Henry Hathaway at Paramount loved Shirley the very first time he saw her and called her "Little Doll". He immediately casted her into "The Last Man". In 1934 she starred in "Bright Eyes". In 1935 she starred in the film "Curly Top". She was the first child to win an Academy Award. She was given a house that came with a child size bathroom, a complete kitchen, and a room for taking naps, a backyard with chickens and rabbits to play with. She starred with Bill Robinson in "Little Colonel", "Rebecca of Sunnybrook", and in 1938 she did "Littlest Rebel", during the "Little Colonel" she got a cold. In 1936 she did the film "Dimples", "Heidi", and "Poor Little Rich Girl". On her 9th birthday she received 135,000 gifts from all over the world. She enrolled at Westlake School, it was a private school for girls. In February, 1941 she signed a 40-week contract with MGM. During April 1945 2 weeks before her 17th birthday Shirley got engaged to John Agar and Shirley Temple got married 3 months later. Shirley became pregnant during the film "Fort Apache". She starred in "The Hagen Girl" in 1947. On January 29, 1948 Linda Susan Agar her daughter was born. In Fall 1949 they divorced at the end of the year during the last film "A kiss for Corliss". On December 15, 1951 she got married to Charles Black. During 1950 George her brother found out he had Multiple Sclerosis. Charles got a job in San Francisco, California, in 1953. In 1958 she starred in the film "The Shirley Temple Story Book", it was a classic movie like "Beauty and the Beast", and Mother Goose. The kids wanted to be in it but they said something like "It was too boring", but Susan would like to write movies instead. Her children were old enough to leave their mother during 1967. Shirley ran for president, she lost. In 1968 She worked to get Richard M. Nixon elected, she went to 22 states, 46 cities, and Europe, and he won. She attended a meeting at the White House in 1969. She was invited to Egypt. In 1971 Nixon appointed Shirley as assistant to Chairman of president council on environment. She moved in with the ambassador in Accra during 1974.
